Facts about Jupiter

It is called after the ancient Roman sky-god, Jupiter, known to the Greeks as Zeus.

Jupiter is the fifth planet from the sun.

Jupiter is the largest planet in our Solar system. It is so big that more than 1300 Earths could fit inside it. Has 63 moons! The first 4 largest moons of Jupiter are called Galilean moons but 46 of them are much smaller ranging.

Jupiter is the stormiest planet in the Solar System. There is a permanent, but ever-changing whirlpool of storms, known as Jupiter's Great Red Spot which can be seen using a telescope. The Red Spot was first seen by Robert Hooke in 1664.

Jupiter is the first of the "gas giants", Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus and Neptune.

Jupiter is made of hydrogen, helium, methane and ammonia. The cloudy sphere has bright belts on it which change their shape.

If you were to descend into Jupiter, the thin, cold atmosphere becomes thicker and hotter, gradually turning into a thick, dark fog. In the blackness about 1000km down the pressure squeezes the atmosphere so hard that it becomes like liquid.
